

## Tip Sheet for creating Accessible Signs

When creating signs, consider using the following strategies to increase the effectiveness of your signs and enhance their legibility for everyone.

- Ensure that the content has a strong colour contrast from the background
- Avoid shiny, reflective materials
- Provide the information in a large size that can be easily read
- Ensure that the placement of the sign is unobstructed and accessible to people who will read it from different heights
- Ensure important signs are well lit at all times of the day
- Use simple fonts such as Arial or Verdana
- Use a mix of upper and lower case
- Avoid using too many words



- Use plain language and avoid complicated terms
- Use bullets or numbers for lists
- Have headings to the left and avoid justifying content
- Avoid words overlapping images
- Use easily recognized symbols or images to help explain important information
- Provide the same content in alternate formats - alternates may include tactile formats or audible signs.
